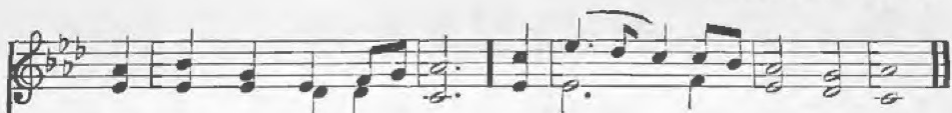
1. O for a faith that will not shrink, Though pressed by man-y a foe;
